In Vedanthangal, the school's are now closed for Summer Holidays. The children had their annual end of year celebrations which included farewell speeches, performances and dances to celebrate the start of their holidays. Schools will re-open in June.

Upskilling Through Sewing



In rural India, it is difficult for women to gain work due to the limited access to education and skills. In order to address these, 15 women participated in a 22-day course in which a tutor came to Vedanthangal to teach them basic sewing skills. They started with hand-stitching techniques and were then shown how to use a sewing machine. At the end of the course, they are able to send their certificate to a government scheme which sends them a free sewing machine. This initiative gives them the freedom to earn money from home by stitching clothes, children's uniforms and alterations, and provides them with better opportunities for their families, as well as promoting women's empowerment.



Brighton Festival Stall


