Now that life is returning to some form of normality we can also restart our Surkupei Project!

These are Thill, Rose and Mumtaz. They live in a rural area of South India called Vedanthangal. They belong to the Dalit caste, one of the poorest in India.

In January 2020, in order to increase the family's income and help Indian Futures, they came up with the idea of making these little bags, called surkupeis, that we would then sell in Spain and the UK.

The surkupeis cost £3 each.
£1 goes to the family,
£1 to Indian Futures and
£1 to cover costs.
