#### **Pongal**

Tamil Nadu celebrated Pongal, a 4-day harvest festival. The first day is a time for clearing out unwanted belongings to symbolise a fresh start. On the second day, people cook Pongal, a rice dish, in a large clay pot outdoors. The Pongal is then painted and placed in the sun as an offering to the Sun God, along with sugar cane stalks. The third day honours farm animals which provide dairy products, a means of transportation and agriculture. Cows and bulls are bathed and their horns are polished and painted in bright colors to celebrate and thank them. The last day is spent celebrating with family and friends.







The students enjoyed the festival and sent photos of their celebrations and Rangoli drawings to their sponsors. The teachers had a gathering together, making biryani rice and playing games.
